

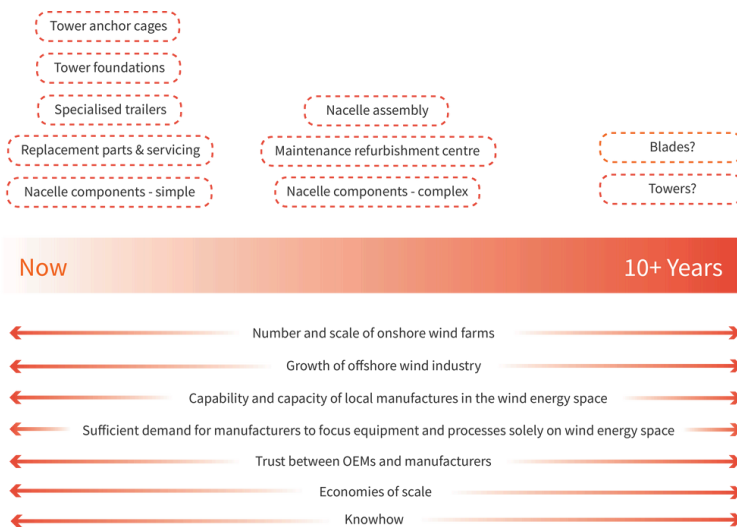
Manufacturing opportunities for wind energy in Western Australia

The Advanced Manufacturing Growth Centre (AMGC) in collaboration with the Western Australian Government have undertaken substantive consultation with industry and local manufacturers to examine opportunities for local entities to enter wind energy supply chains including components, construction and maintenance undertaken in Western Australia (WA).

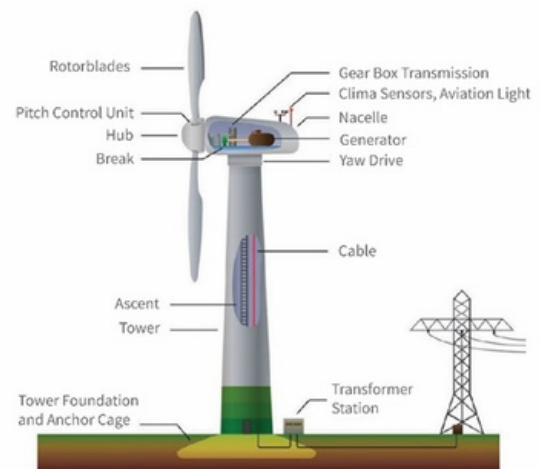
Based on AMGC's research findings, it has developed the Wind Energy Manufacturing Co-investment Program to target its initial co-funding at **maximising program impact**.

AMGC's initial co-funding program will target manufacturing opportunities addressing wind tower foundations, tower anchor cages, targeted nacelle components, replacement parts, and fabrication of specialised trailers.

AMGC and the Western Australian Government will continue to support manufacturing opportunities as demand grows, potentially including nacelle assembly and the development of a WA wind energy refurbishment centre in future years.

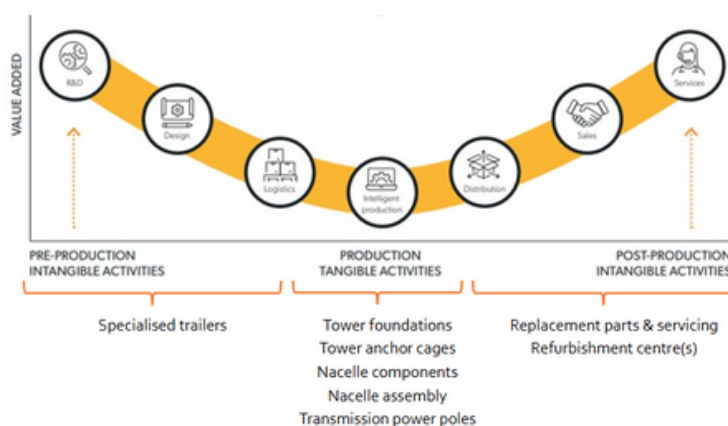


Potential sequencing for local manufacturing of wind turbine components. Source: Hatch, 2024

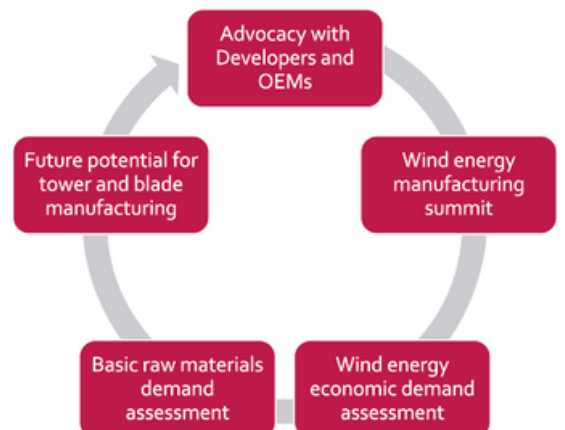

The **\$8 million co-investment and advice program** will act as a pilot initiative to inform future co-funding rounds which aim to unlock further capability and prosperity benefits for WA in line with the significant number of anticipated wind farm projects to come on line.
